ABSENTEES

Parents are reminded that written absentee notes with student name, date, reason for absence and parent signature MUST be provided for all student absences - a legal requirement from the Education Department of WA. Please notify the school by phone call or email if your child will be absent.

When teachers have completed class rolls each morning, the school office will SMS parents for any unexplained/not notified absences each day.

Students arriving at school late, i.e. after the morning siren, MUST come through the office and be signed in by their parent/caregiver. Should a student need to leave school early, their parent/caregiver must sign the student out at the office, even though the class teacher may have been notified. Our Duty of Care requires us to account for each student during school hours, 8:45am to 3:10pm.

Remember, even though you have phoned or emailed the school with your child's absence, you must still send a signed note. This is a legal requirement.

LATE ARRIVAL/EARLY DEPARTURE

Students arriving late or leaving early must come through the office and be signed in/out by their parent/caregiver. Arriving late, but before 9.40 am, will be recorded as LATE. Arriving after 9.40am will be recorded as a half day absence. Leaving early, before 2:45pm will be recorded as a half day absence.

PARENTS VISITING DURING SCHOOL HOURS

Parents are reminded that if they visit the school during school hours (including parents assisting in classes and the Canteen), they are required to sign in and sign out at the office. This enables us to account for everyone on the school site in the case of an emergency. Our Duty of Care also requires us to know who is on the school site during school hours.

SCHOOL FEE DISCOUNTS FOR HEALTH CARE CARD AND PENSION CONCESSION CARD HOLDERS

Do you have a Family Health Care Card or Parent Pension Card?

The Catholic Education Office provides discounts for the above Centrelink Concession cards. A substantial discount is allocated to the tuition cost for each student on completion of a claim form and presenting your card at the office for copying. Claim forms are available from the school office and attached with this newsletter.

If you have another type of concession card that is an asset tested concession, please see Karen Depiazzi to check if you are eligible to receive the discount.

Applications are to be submitted by Wednesday 10 February 2016.
