THE BISHOPS' RELIGIOUS LITERACY ASSESSMENT 2015 YEAR THREE AND YEAR FIVE

Next week the Year Three and Five classes will be participating in the Bishops' Religious Literacy Assessment. The BRLA provides a 'point in time' snapshot of student performance in Religious Education. Students' knowledge and understanding of the content of the RE curriculum is assessed using a combination of multiple choice, short and extended response items. Students' faith is not assessed. The use of the BRLA complements the school based assessment programs in RE.
