JOHN WALKER MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP Marist or Mercy Campus YEAR 7 2017

Purpose of the Award

The John Walker Music Scholarship is in memory of the late Mr John Walker, a former School Principal in the Bunbury Diocese. To honour John and his love of music, the Bunbury Catholic primary schools would like to assist a student, to develop their own passion for music.

Students from local Catholic Primary Schools entering Year 7, 2017, at Bunbury Catholic College (Marist or Mercy) are invited to apply for the 2017 John Walker Music Scholarship. It is a merit-based Scholarship given annually. Only students who currently attend a local Catholic Primary School are eligible for this scholarship.

Scholarship

The Music Scholarship will cover full music tuition fees for one year. The recipient is expected to commit to a music ensemble and demonstrate exemplary behavior in areas of school. The recipient is subject to all of the rules and regulations of the College's Instrumental music policies including instrument hire agreements and attendance.

Criteria

The John Walker Music Scholarship is made with consideration to the following criteria:

- The student's record of experience and/or outcome of a music aptitude tests
- · The student's academic record
- The potential for the applicant to contribute to a school ensemble

Obligations

Students receiving Scholarship Awards will be expected to fulfil the responsibilities of the award. These will include consistent attendance to lessons, involvement in one or more school bands or ensemble groups and demonstration of exemplary behaviour and attitude. Students are expected to commit to their tuition scholarship for the duration of the year.

How to Apply

Students should submit a completed application form before Wednesday 19th OCTOBER 2016.

There is no audition required in the application process, however, a music aptitude test will be completed by each applicant. This test will be held on Tuesday 25th October 2016 at 4.30pm at the MARIST Campus Performing Arts Centre. Students will not be considered unless an application is received and testing is completed.
