Offer of Skin Cancer Checks for the St Mary's Community

21/9/17

Dear Parents

With the prevalence of skin cancer in Australia and in a bid to help staff, parents and grandparents stay healthy, at my previous school I was able to organise skin checks by a doctor for those staff and parents who were interested.

I approached Dr Alejandra Olgiati recently and asked her about the possibility of arranging opportunities for the St Mary's community to access discounted checks and she consulted her Practice Manager. Alejandra is able to offer our families skin checks at the Brecken Bunbury Clinic on Monday 6 November from 12pm to 8pm with 15 minute appointments. Visits on that day will be bulk billed through Medicare and bookings can be made through the St Mary's office from now until the end of October. If Alejandra is inundated, a second date will be arranged.

Skin checks are something we often have intentions of carrying out but may not get around to. Here is an opportunity to make it happen. Below are some statistics on just how common skin cancer is and the consequences can be deadly.

Skin Cancer Statistics

Approximately, two in three Australians will be diagnosed with skin cancer by the time they are 70, with more than 750,000 people treated for one or more non-melanoma skin cancers in Australia each year. Non-melanoma skin cancer is more common in men, with almost double the incidence compared to women.

Excluding non-melanoma skin cancer,* melanoma is the third most common cancer in Australians. In 2013, 12,744 Australians were diagnosed with melanoma.

Every year, in Australia:

- skin cancers account for around 80% of all newly diagnosed cancers
- the majority of skin cancers are caused by exposure to the sun
- GPs have over 1 million patient consultations per year for skin cancer
- the incidence of skin cancer is one of the highest in the world, two to three times the rates in Canada, the US and the UK.

In 2014, 2067 people died from skin cancer in Australia, 1467 from melanoma and 600 from non-melanoma skin cancers.



Re: Whooping Cough health advice - St Mary's Catholic Primary School

There has been a confirmed case of whooping cough diagnosed at St Mary's Catholic Primary School. I write to advise that if your child has developed a coughing illness or if they develop a coughing illness in the next 1-2 weeks, take them to see a doctor as soon as possible, for possible testing and treatment. If your child is <u>well and has no symptoms</u>, there is no need for any further action.

Symptoms of whooping cough can include persistent coughing, breathing difficulties and often coughing to the point of gagging or vomiting. A flu-like illness may come before the coughing stage. Infants and young children may also make a 'whooping' sound during coughing bouts, but this sound does not always occur.

Adolescents and adults can also have the disease with the only symptom being a cough lasting several weeks or months. It is important to have such coughs assessed by a doctor because if one person in the family has whooping cough, it is likely to spread to the rest of the family, including vulnerable young children.

The incubation period for the disease averages 7-10 days, with people infectious from the onset of the first symptom (cold/flu-like illness or cough) to 3 weeks after the onset of coughing. Antibiotic treatment reduces the length of the infectious period if diagnosed early enough.

It is spread to others by droplets from coughing or sneezing. Untreated, a person with whooping cough can spread it to other people for up to three weeks after the onset of cough.

Five full days of antibiotic treatment needs to be completed before they can return to school. Children who have symptoms and who have tested positive, need to stay away from school until 5 days of antibiotics are completed.

Whooping cough is a debilitating disease for young children who are not immunised and can be fatal especially for babies under 6 months of age. Vaccination is the most important way of reducing pertussis risk in our community – but even fully vaccinated children and adults can still get the disease, although it is usually a milder illness.

It is important to double check that your child is fully up to date with his or her immunisations against whooping cough (pertussis). Free whooping cough vaccinations are recommended for 2, 4, 6 and 18 month old babies, 3.5 year old children and Year 8 students in high school. People who work with children and babies are also recommended to have a whooping cough booster 10 years after their last whooping cough vaccination.

If you are unsure of your child's vaccination status, please see your doctor or community immunisation provider for information and vaccination if necessary. You can also call the Australian Immunisation Register on 1800 653 809.

Re: Chicken Pox

There has recently been a case of suspected chicken pox within the school community.

Chicken pox is a common childhood illness characterised by fever, fatigue and a generalised, itchy rash of blisters that usually starts on the trunk and face and spreads to the arms and legs. About 5% of cases do not develop a rash. It is usually more severe in adults and immunosuppressed people including non-immune pregnant women.

How is Chicken Pox Spread?

By inhaling respiratory droplets from an infected person or by contact with liquid in the blisters.

Incubation period:

Following exposure it usually takes 13 – 17 days for the rash to develop.

How long is it infectious to other people?

For 2 days before the rash starts and until all blisters have crusted over.

What are the responsibilities of parents about exclusion from school and childcare?

Children with chicken pox should immediately be excluded from childcare facilities and schools, for at least 5 days after the rash appears and until all blisters have crusted.

Contacts of sick children

Contacts of children with chickenpox are not excluded from school however immunosuppressed classmates or pregnant contacts should be referred to their doctor. High-risk children who are contacts of a case can sometimes be vaccinated in time to prevent infection. Information about this is available through your doctor or the SW Population Health Unit

Treatment

Chicken pox is usually mild and most patients won't require treatment, but your child needs to see a doctor for possible antiviral treatment if they develop a very high fever, start vomiting or develop rapid breathing or become drowsy.

<u>Immunisation</u>

Vaccination against chicken pox is recommended for people of all age groups who haven't already had chicken pox infection. Free chicken pox vaccination has been provided for 18 month old children since November 2005, and also for adolescents through the Year 8 school-based immunisation program.

Dear Parents/Carers.

The impact of social media and technology on our youth is ever increasing and we are seeing the effects of it on an almost daily basis. Mobile technology is giving children unprecedented access to the internet - access that they are not always ready to manage wisely. Perhaps it is the innocence of youth, but the choices many children make in what they post on social media can have long-

Our P&C have partnered with The Parenting Connection, Headspace and the City of Bunbury to provide a FREE screening of the film Screenagers (Rated 10+) on Thursday and Friday October 19 and 20 at the Waters Edge Cafe (7:00pm). The film will be followed by a Youth Focused interactive workshop led by ySafe director Jordan Foster for children aged 10+ and their parents.

We have previously had the privilege of Jordan speaking to the children, teachers and some parents from our school through a grant obtained by the school. All concerned found the workshops informative and instructive. Jordan gives a strong message about the importance of being responsible online and an understanding of the traps and pitfalls in using the internet.

The maker of the Screenagers (Delaney Ruston) and Jordan Foster both agree that when parents/carers and their children work together, the risks posed by social media and the internet can be reduced.

It is due to this belief that The Parenting Connection have paid for the screening costs on both of these nights s that parents and their children are able to attend for FREE.

These two sessions will be advertised to other schools but the involvement of our P&C has given us a head start. I would strongly encourage parents to grasp this opportunity to get prepare the inevitable challenges social media and technology will present for them and their children.

Attached to this note is information about the film and the guest speaker along with how to reserve free seats for you and your children aged 10+.

If you are unable to attend these free screenings, the P&C have also arranged for screenings on the Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday (6:30pm) at the Grand Cinema – at a cost of \$23 per ticket. Information about these three nights will be provided through the School App.

The capacity for people to track children through photos they post from their phones, the peer pressure to post inappropriate images or to write inappropriate comments, the inability to 'take these things back' and the potential future impact on our children are real. This film and workshop will open your eyes as to what is out there and can happen. Please take the opportunity to learn as much as you can in order to help your children learn how to be safe in the technological world they are in
