

If you go for the "We" attitude and work with your child's teacher, then your child will have a great school year and so will you, and, with a bit of luck, so will the teacher. #### KISS AND DRIVE GUIDELINES

Thank you to students and families for following our Kiss and Drive Guidelines, ensuring the safety of all who use this facility to pick students up after school and to drop students off in the morning. A copy of the guidelines accompanies this newsletter. Should a grandparent or other family member be picking up your children, parents are asked to inform them of the Kiss and Drive process and guidelines. Also, please be aware that if you park in diagonal parking in the car park in front of the Administration building on Mary Street at the end of the school day, you may not reverse out into the flow of Kiss and Drive traffic, but will need to remain there until the traffic has finished - usually 3.30pm. This condition is in place to ensure safety of students and to avoid vehicle collisions vehicles using Kiss and Drive are not expecting cars to reverse out of the diagonal parking.

### STUDENT BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT

Students at St Mary's are supported in their learning, socialising with others, resilience and behaviour regulation and management. St Mary's Behaviour Management Policy is available on the school website.

Expectations, rules and consequences (both positive and negative) are clearly explained to students. There is a strong emphasis on providing positive and affirming feedback to students.

Occasionally, a student may have playground privileges withdrawn - either sit on the bench or walk with the duty teacher - as a consequence of inappropriate behaviour.

This year, a sticker will be placed in the student's diary/communication book to notify parents if this occurs. Parents are asked to support the school in developing positive and appropriate student behaviours by discussing

with the child what they did wrong and their expectation that school rules are followed. Thank you for your ongoing support in ensuring a safe and harmonious learning and play environment at our school.



### **Dear Parents**

In the interests of safety of our students, the School Board outlines the following directions for parents and students when using the Kiss and Drive area, either before or after school.

- Students may only exit or enter the car when the car is stationary in either of the yellow bays at the exit end of the drive through area. It has been reported to the Office that some parents are stopping inside the entrance to drop off children in the morning. Please do not continue with this unsafe practice.
- 2. If a parent needs to get out of the car to assist a child/children with bags, then please do not use Kiss and Drive, but park your vehicle instead.
- When stopping and waiting in the Kiss and Drive area, please put on handbrake while car is idling. This may be inconvenient but the driver can become easily or momentarily distracted, causing the car to move forward into the vehicle in front.
- 4. DO NOT have children use the boot for schoolbags. Again, this may be inconvenient but, again, we are concerned with safety for children and would not wish for children to be pinned between their vehicle and the one behind.
- 5. Children need to exit and enter the car from the left hand side, thus avoiding the need to walk between two "idling" vehicles. We acknowledge that some families have baby seats, making it difficult for older children to get out. Children who need to exit or enter from the right hand side of the vehicle must walk in front of their own car. In this way, the parent can ensure their own child has crossed safely before the car moves on.
- Parents/visitors who park in the diagonal bays in the carpark at the front of the school are not permitted to reverse out of these bays into the flow of traffic between 3:10 and 3:30pm. The driver / car will need to wait until traffic has ceased.
- 7. Please advise grandparents / friends / family members who may occasionally pick up children from school about this regulation.

Signs with these directions are installed in the Kiss and Drive area. These directions are made in the interests of safety for our students. I ask that all users of the Kiss and Drive area use these guidelines, regardless of momentary inconvenience. Parents not able to follow these guidelines are asked not to use the Kiss and Drive area.

Thank you all in anticipation of your support in following these safety guidelines.
