Centenary of Our Lady of Fatima

The year 2017 marks the 100th anniversary of the apparitions of Our Lady to the three shepherd children at Fatima, Portugal, where the Blessed Mother appeared once each month from May 13 until Oct. 13, 1917.

The message of Fatima highlights many central truths and devotions of the Catholic faith: the Trinity, the Eucharist, Penance, the Rosary and sacrifices for the conversion of sinners. There is special emphasis on the Immaculate Heart of Mary, because Mary is full of God's grace and is all pure. She has the heart of a mother who cares for her children and wishes them to be saved by her Son, Jesus.

Fatima is one of the most significant of all Marian apparitions. Along with

Guadalupe (Dec. 12) and Lourdes (Feb. 11), it is one of three Marian apparitions honoured with a feast day by the Catholic Church. In 2002, Pope St. John Paul II added the May 13 feast of Our Lady of Fatima to the general Roman calendar.

It is estimated that some 4-5 million people visit Fatima each year, and more are expected for the centennial year, including a visit by Pope Francis, who plans to travel to Portugal to celebrate the 100 year anniversary.



O Most Holy Virgin Mary, Queen of the most holy Rosary, you were pleased to appear to the children of Fatima and reveal a glorious message. We implore you, inspire in our hearts a fervent love for the recitation of the Rosary. By meditating on the mysteries of the redemption that are recalled therein may we obtain the graces and virtues that we ask, through the merits of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Redeemer.

On Tuesday I was in a privileged position to be invited to the Mother's Day Mass and Morning Tea. Father Abraham presented a tribute and blessing of the mothers and grandmothers and aunties present and it was a timely reminder of the love and care that they show us every day.

At the Mother's Day Morning Tea I was in awe of the organisation of the event. There was incredible support from local businesses and from those who attended. A huge thank you to Gemma Millar and Zoe Marwick for coordinating as Pre Primary P & F Reps, and to the huge team of Pre Primary parents who cooked, decorated, waited on tables, set up and dismantled what was a huge event. Those gathered were entertained with some impressive singing and dancing from our Pre Primary students. Special thanks also to Mel Toia who was our MC throughout the morning. We are also thankful to the seven Bunbury Catholic College students who assisted in

running a crèche for mothers involved. The St Mary's community is incredibly grateful to all of those involved and more than \$10 000 was raised to buy classroom resources for the benefit of our students.

After being at camp yesterday and staying overnight I am pleased to report that the Year 6 camp is going extremely well with the students accepting the many challenges they have been faced. Students have had to work in teams and listen and support each other to complete some difficult tasks from kayaking to rock climbing and abseiling. One of the cooks at camp said that in our group's first five minutes at camp, the class had said more "thank yous" than she had received in the previous two weeks! Mr Priest is doing an amazing job in marshalling the troops and he has been well supported by Mr Alberti, and a team of enthusiastic parents, with Mrs Toia driving up this morning.

Next week is an important one for our Year 3 and 5 students with them involved in NAPLAN testing. Testing across Australia will start on Tuesday and finish on Thursday. The tests are a useful tool to gauge a snapshot of students' progress and is one of many assessments used at St Mary's.

Parking is an ongoing problem, particularly outside the Kindy and Pre Primary classrooms. I have been made aware that the City of Bunbury Ranger has told some of our parents that if they park where they shouldn't they will be fined. I am keen to hear if you have ideas on solving the problem and will discuss the matter with staff and the School Board.

Hosting French Students in July (14 July-16 August)

For the last 9 years a programme has been in place offering the opportunity to young French students aged 14-17 years to discover Australia and its education system.

We are looking for families willing to host students for the four weeks of their visit. They will travel to and from School with your children. The purpose of the programme is for these French students to experience living with an

Australian family, to see how an Australian school operates, to improve their English language skills through this full immersion and to create a strong friendship with their Anglophone peers. The programme is highly successful and both Australians and French students greatly enjoy the exchange. Many families still keep in touch with each other.

The students are fully briefed about the school rules, are not to leave the school premises and will attend classes daily. They will be fully covered by appropriate insurance.

opening their eyes (and ears!) to similarly minded students for an extended period.
