BISHOP'S RELIGIOUS LITERACY ASSESSMENT

On Monday 1 August the Year 5 class will participate in the BRLA Online for the first time. Year 3 will sit this assessment on Monday 8 August, after a practice on Monday 1 August. The purpose of the assessment is to measure student learning of content in the Religious Education Curriculum. The BRLA provides a 'point in time' snapshot of student performance in Religious Education in Years 3,5 and 9. The assessment is a combination of multiple choice, short and long response items. Students' faith is not assessed, rather their knowledge and understanding of religious education content. The results of this assessment allow the school to plan and teach Religious Education more effectively.

Today each class celebrated the annual National Tree Planting Day by planting a tree on the school grounds. As five of the trees are deciduous, it will be wonderful to observe the trees grow and transform throughout the years to come.

Class and area	Tree Species	Photo
Pre Primary ELC grounds	Cercis Canadensis - American Redbud Small deciduous tree with show of pink flowers in Spring and providing shade in Summer before Autumn colour. This is a pretty tree for small gardens or courtyards. Size: 5 m x 4m	
Kindy: ELC grounds Year 6: Teacher courtyard	Catalpa bignoides - Indian Bean Tree A large tree with a broad dome-shaped canopy and large long-stalked leaves. In Summer it carries bell-shaped flowers in white, various pink shades, and soft apricot- orange, followed by clusters of long, pendulous, bean-like seed capsules, hence its common name. Size: 15m x 9m	
Year 1 and Year 2 Assembly grass area	Pyrus calleryana 'Bradford' - Ornamental Pear Small deciduous tree with show of white flowers in Spring and providing shade in Summer months before vibrant Autumn colour. Size: 5 m x 4m	
Year 3, Year 4 and Year 5 Soccer oval boundary	Agonis flexuosa - Weeping Peppermint Medium native tree, local to the South West. Grows in a weeping habit and provides habitat for the endangered Western Ringtail Possum and other native species. Size: to 15m × 9m	

How we can care for these trees so they blossom and grow at St Mary's...

- Be mindful, when playing, of the trees growing leaves and branches
- Tipping water from water bottles on the new trees at the end of the day
