One goal this year is to develop our skills in giving specific feedback to students that promotes learning. Our mantra is "Feedback helps me learn." Praise in the nature of "Good Boy", "Well done", "That's great", "Excellent", "You got 10/10", has value in itself. We all like praise. But it has little worth in telling what it is exactly that I did well (in relation to a goal), and what I need to do next to learn more, improve or get better.

There is greater worth in saying, "You thought carefully about what the question was asking, you read the question again and you decided on a strategy to solve the problem. Well done, that worked," rather than "You got it right." In this way, the student is being affirmed in what they are doing rather than just getting it right. The student is therefore more likely to repeat this process with the next problem/task. Similarly with reading: "You knew that word didn't make sense/didn't look right and you went back to have another go to sound it out/think about what made sense. Well done. That's a great way to work."

This affirms and develops students' skillsets. Parents might try this with affirming desired behaviours or completing chores. You may find it is not as easy to do as you might think and that it requires conscious effort to give specific feedback. Our goal is to develop our students as independent thinkers and problem solvers in all facets of life - academic and social.

#### SCHOOL FEE STATEMENTS

School fee statements have been sent home with students this week. This statement shows the total fees for the year as well as the term one fees. Term one fees are due by Wednesday 16 March 2016.

This year to reduce the collection of money in class rooms for events such as the swimming carnival, athletics carnival, winter carnival and in term swimming lessons during the year, we have included these in the swimming/ athletics fee. This has been calculated for each year level to include only the ones students from that year will participate in. Students will need to pay as you go for events where there is a selection/qualifier process to participate, i.e. Interschool events.

St Mary's offers EFTPOS facilities, BPay, direct debit and cash/cheque options for payment. Should you wish to set up a direct debit for fee payment, please collect a form from the school office. There are also forms available from the office if you need to change details for existing direct debits.

LAST CALL for Health Care Card – Parenting Pension Single discount applications. This is a significant discount offered by the Catholic Education Office for those parents who have a current HCC, LIH, PPS or DVA PCC (Blue) card. This discount doesn't apply to HCC held by a student.
