Dear Parents, Students and Friends,

Principal's Welcome

I am currently at the Catholic Principals' Conference in Perth and the theme of the conference is 'Getting Better at Being Better.' On Tuesday I had the opportunity to listen to Tim Costello, who is a Baptist Minister and the former Director of World Vision (and brother of Peter Costello). Tim spoke about how Australia needs to get better as a country and described the poverty we have in our own backyard. Tim quoted Bob Hawke's 1987 statement that 'By 1990, no Australian child will be living in poverty.' We still have 730 000, or 17.4% of Australian children living in poverty. Disadvantaged backgrounds often leads to limited educational opportunities making it hard for children to break the poverty cycle. Being disadvantaged results in students being 2 - 3 years behind on average in schooling by the age of fifteen. While the Federal Government is attempting to address the issue with additional funding for schools based on needs, money alone will not fix the problem. Tim says that a positive culture also promotes success, but Australia's culture is becoming more fragmented with less emphasis on community and more on individualism. Teenagers are gauging success in life by their number of online friends and they want to show that their life is more impressive than anyone else's by putting everything that they do on Facebook. But there is hope. Tim suggested schools need to teach about social justice and children need to develop an intrinsic fairness and that creating community is one of the world's greatest challenges.

Kiss and Drive Protocols



In the interests of the safety of our students, the School outlines the following directions for parents and students when using the Kiss and Drive area, either before or after school.

- 1. Students are to make their way to Kiss and Drive using the pathway between Year 3 and the Office. Please do not use the oval or pathway next to Year 2 to access Kiss and Drive.
- 2. Students are to stand with their siblings under the bus shelter facing Mary St. They are to watch for their car and move to the duty teacher when necessary.
- 3. Students may **only exit or enter the car when the car is stationary in either of the yellow bays** at the exit end of the drive through area. If a parent needs to get out of the car to assist a child/children with bags, then please do not use Kiss and Drive, but park your vehicle instead.
- 4. When stopping and waiting in the Kiss and Drive area, please put on handbrake while car is idling. This may be inconvenient but the driver can become easily or momentarily distracted, causing the car to move forward into the vehicle in front.
- 5. Children are **not to use the boot for schoolbags.** Again, this may be inconvenient, but we are concerned with safety of children and would not wish for children to be pinned between their vehicle and the one behind.
- 6. Children need to **exit and enter the car from the left hand side**, thus avoiding the need to walk between two "idling" vehicles. We acknowledge that some families have baby seats, making it difficult for older children to get out. Children who need to exit or enter from the right hand side of the vehicle must walk in front of their own car. In this way, the parent can ensure their own child has crossed safely before the car moves on.
- 7. Parents/visitors who park in the diagonal bays in the carpark at the front of the school are not permitted to reverse out of these bays into the flow of traffic between 8.30am and 8.45am and 3pm and 3.30pm. The driver/car will need to wait until traffic has ceased.
- 8. Please advise grandparents/friends/family members who may occasionally pick up children from school about this regulation.

Signs with these directions are installed in the Kiss and Drive area. These directions are made in the interests of safety for our students. **All users** of the Kiss and Drive area **use these guidelines**, regardless of momentary inconvenience.

STUDENTS ARRIVING LATE TO SCHOOL

Students arriving at school late, i.e. after the morning siren which sounds at 8.45am, MUST process through the office and be signed in by their parent/caregiver. This includes Mondays and Fridays during assembly. Thank you.

ABSENTEES

Parents are reminded that written absentee notes with student name, date, reason for absence and parent signature MUST be provided for all student absences - a legal requirement from the Education Department of WA. Please notify the school by phone call or email if your child will be absent.

When teachers have completed class rolls each morning, the school office will SMS parents for any unexplained/not notified absences each day.

Remember, even though you have phoned or emailed the school with your child's absence, you must still send a signed note. This is a legal requirement.

HAIR

Hair should be always neat and tidy and should not reflect the extremes of any current fashion. Long hair must be kept neatly tied back. Ribbons or clips **must be** PLAIN white or blue. Matching headbands can be purchased from the Uniform Shop. Hair must be kept at the student's natural hair colour, without artificial hair colour added.

<u> 1 Base</u>

A 2 litre milk carton (any sort of bottle with a handle - handles are best as this is a control point they can use to hold/move their puppet) or an egg carton.

1 x hair option

Good things for puppet hair may be: yarn, string, wires, wool, rope, old fabric scraps, videotape plastic, feathers that they find outside - anything they can imagine/find that could be used as hair.

1 x eyes option

Good things for eyes: Buttons, bottle caps, old computer keys, pieces of cut up coloured paper – anything you can imagine/find.

Give these items to your class teacher for storage. Bring in as many of these types of items as you can!!



Keeping mentally healthy is just as important as keeping physically healthy.

Working within a school means you regularly engage with a wide range of people. This often includes students who have emotional and psychological distress. It is important to understand your personal and professional boundaries, and the impact of compassion fatigue.

Clinical Psychologist Karen Huggett, *Direction Psychological Services* Director, has over 20 years' experience working with adults, children, families and couples. She has a particular interest in working with children and teenagers and a focus on providing early intervention and preventative programs within the Perth community. The workshop will include:

- The most common child & adolescent mental health issues and how to recognise the signs
- Understanding your school policy, including referrals to a psychologist Compassion fatigue: what is it and what are the signs Strategies for setting practical boundaries at work
- Recognising your own signs of stress
- Implementing self-care and stress management strategies.



Who should attend: canteen staff and volunteers, parent body representatives, parents and school nurses. Other members of your school community, including the Principal and teachers, are also welcome to attend.
