Dear Parents, Students and Friends,

Students are well settled in to the school year and classroom routines are established. Thank you to parents for your support in the partnership we share. Both parents and teachers have been commenting on how tired the children seem to be (so early in the school year), particularly the younger students. I encourage parents to plan for some downtime/rest time over the up and coming long weekend - Thursday 3 March to Tuesday 8 March.

One attribute of being a successful learner and achieving goals is persistence. The ability to persist at a task and see it through to the end is one of the most important success attributes that we, parents and teachers, can develop in our students. There are numerous times everyday, both at home and at school, when children must

persist rather than give in, e.g. a child learning to tie shoelaces must persist; a student must show determination to finish tasks, particularly those he/she doesn't understand or complete straight away. Children need the "stickability" to work through difficulties and hang in there when things don't go their way. Parents can promote persistence by encouraging children to keep going and not give in at the slightest hurdle or difficulty. Making life too easy so that children don't have the opportunity to persist or hang in there can impede the development of persistence. "You Can Do It" is far more powerful than, "if it is a little hard, then try something else."

Michael Grose, parenting expert, suggests the following four strategies that parents

HOLY YEAR OF MERCY PRAYER

can use to promote a sense of persistence in children.

- 1. Develop a vocabulary for persistence. Words like "Hang tough", "Work Hard" and "Hang in there" can become part of their everyday vocabulary.
- 2. Point out to children when they stick at a task. Most parents know it pays off when they catch their children being good but it also pays off to catch them being persistent. The behaviours you focus on as parents expand, so let them know when they have been persistent. Also, remind them that persistence generally pays off.
- 3. Help children to remember times when they experienced success by HANGING IN when they were younger. Let them know that persistence has paid off before and it will again.
- 4. Talk about HARD WORK with your children. They need to understand that to be successful they sometimes need to do things that are NOT fun or easy. While it would be good if all work and learning was fun, in reality, this is not always the case.



Hello and welcome to Marist St Mary's Junior Netball 2016.

If your daughter would like to play NSG Set Modified or Junior netball this year, then please read the netball attachments.

Required Forms

All Net & Set Players need to fill out the St Mary's Registration online by visiting the direct registration page: My Netball website. Select Club Marist St Mary's and in the registration drop box select Net or Set depending which one you are registering for.

Payments/Rego must be made online by Tuesday 23 March 2016.

All Junior Players need to fill out the St Mary's Registration Form on-line.

Parents and players of all Juniors, Net and Set groups please read and sign the Code of Conduct and return to the office with uniform and wind up monies \$30. Payments/Rego must be made online by 18 March 2016.

UNIFORMS:

This year there is a \$20 non-refundable bond for the uniforms. This fee is charged as the quality of the uniforms is deteriorating. This is necessary so when the time comes to replace the uniforms, we have already raised the funds for them.

Every year we take an extra \$10 to cover the wind up. Please bring this in a separate envelope with the St Mary's Code of Conduct Form and Uniform Payment. These can be left at the School office for collection or given to Jenelle O'Reilly.

Parents must be prepared to do Canteen and Sausage Sizzle roster. Failing to do so this year will result in fines and loss of team premiership points.

These are the conditions you agree to abide with when you choose to play netball with a team from Marist St Mary's Catholic Primary School.

All signed Code of conducts must be returned to the office by 18 MARCH 2016. Sorry but NO LATE ENROLMENTS WILL BE ACCEPTED. Once the forms are in, I will place the girls in a team. *Teams at St Mary's are organised by D.O.B.). I will register the teams with BNA, you will then need to register your daughter online. Once notified as to which team your daughter is in, you will then need to register and pay your fees to BNA ONLINE.

JUNIORS 10-18 years = \$160.00

NSG NET 5-7 years (or first time players up to 10) = \$90.00 INCLUDING PACK

NSG SET 8-10 years = \$120.00 INCLUDING PACK

All registrations to be completed online for renewals and new registrations via the MyNetball program. All registrations for the Juniors close 18 March 2016 and for NET & SET age groups, registrations close 23rd March 2016.

All registrations are to be completed via the MyNetball program. Simply click on BNA website address above Select Registration Forms. A drop down box will appear with the various clubs at BNA. Select Marist St Mary's. You will require an ID number to log on, please use existing login details, if you have forgotten your password and follow the link to generate a new one. Please note players will be asked to register to a club not a team. All clubs are listed on the website under "Clubs". Follow the payment instructions when filling out the registration form. Please make sure you complete all boxes with correct spacing as it will not let you progress with your registration.

*Offline payments can only be selected by individuals paying with a KidSport Voucher.

No late KidSport Vouchers will be accepted at all this year. Vouchers must be stamped, signed and authorised by the relevant shire office and posted to BNA PO Box 1035 Bunbury 6231 by 15 March 2016 or handed in to the Club Registrar before the club registration closing date. Phone your local shire office to find out where KS vouchers can be lodged. City of Bunbury is located at the SWSC.

Bunbury Netball Association/St Mary's Coaches and Managers Code of Conduct

- Encourage and provide opportunities for children to participate, learn in a fun and safe environment and always according to the rules.
- Show respect to all players, coaches and officials
- Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake.
- Never argue with an official. If you disagree, raise the issue through the appropriate channels rather than questioning an official's judgment and honesty in public.
- O Demonstrate appropriate social behaviour by not using foul language, harassing players, coaches or officials.
- o Remember that children learn best from example. Applaud good plays by all teams.
- Support all efforts to remove all physical and verbal abuse from sporting activities.
- o Condemn the use of violence in any form, be it by spectators, coaches, officials or players.
- Recognise the importance of all volunteers.
- o Equal court time for every player participating in Netta and Sub Junior competition is strongly encouraged.

Bunbury Netball Association/St Mary's Parent/Spectators Code of Conduct

We understand that netball games and training are not to be used as a babysitting facility.

- Encourage children to participate and always according to the rules.
- Cheer for your child and their team, but remember that the coach is the director of the team and plays, so let them be heard too.
- Show respect to all players, coaches, opposition players, spectators and officials.
- Focus on my child's efforts and performance rather than winning or losing. Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a
 mistake or losing a competition.
- Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake.
- Never argue with an official. If you disagree, discuss the matter with your coach after the game and raise the issue through the appropriate channels rather than questioning an official's judgment and honesty in public.
- Demonstrate appropriate social behaviour by not using foul language, harassing players, coaches or officials.
- Remember that children learn best from example. Applaud good plays by all teams.
- Support all efforts to remove all physical and verbal abuse from sporting activities. Condemn the use of violence in any form, be it by spectators, coaches, officials or players.
- Ensure that any spectators I have brought to the game (family members or friends) to watch my child also abide by our Code of Conduct.
- Support the player/team/club/association when able and required.
- o Recognise the importance of all volunteers, coaches, officials and administrators and show appreciation.

Bunbury Netball Association/St Mary's Players Code of Conduct

- Play by the rules.
- o Show respect to other team members, coaches, umpires, and spectators even if this is not reciprocated.
- o Show respect at all times to those in authority on and off the court.
- o Never argue with an official. If you disagree, discuss the matter with your coach after the game.
- Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials or other players, or provoking an opponent is not acceptable.
- Treat all players as you would like to be treated. Do not interfere with, bully or take unfair advantage of another player.
- Avoid using derogatory language. Swearing or profanity is unacceptable.
- Play to the best of your ability.
- Treat with respect all facilities and equipment.
- Support and promote good sportsmanship at all times before and during the game, ensuring that there is no swearing, loss of self-control or any other unsportsmanlike behaviour.
