### Principal's Welcome

School is a little hectic at the moment with staff carrying out final assessments for students to assist them in their report writing. Staff are also planning the end of year activities, while much thought is going into the 2018 school year.

In 2018 our 3 Year Old Program will begin under the guidance of Mrs Bianca Torrisi and we are closing in on the maximum of twenty enrolments. We are currently in the process of sorting out, painting and buying furniture for the old Playgroup room that will be used on Tuesday mornings for Play Café, and Fridays for 3 Year Olds. ## Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration 24/7 in the Chapel

Dear parents,

Last week years 3-6 experienced a beautiful spiritual time of Eucharistic adoration led by Fr Antoine Thomas, a visiting priest from New Zealand. Fr Antoine reminded the children about the very basis of Catholic Faith....that Jesus is truly present in the consecrated bread and wine of Holy Communion and encouraged them to seek to know God intimately through spending time with Him where he is truly present on earth. Your child may ask to visit Jesus and this is easy, as He is there in every tabernacle. There is also a children's group that meets for Eucharistic adoration at the Cathedral (dates and times to be announced.) The regular practice of spending time in silence with Our Lord this way will allow children to develop a personal relationship with Jesus who is God. It makes such a difference in the lives of our children in a world where they may struggle to find peace. Your child has also been encouraged to have a little 'prayer corner'. This can be a bedside table with a little cross, either bought or made by your child and a statue or picture of Our Lady. Spending a little time in quiet prayer at the beginning and end of each day to thank, to ask and simply to get to know God, helps a child in their spiritual journey and brings them peace. This year the Year 4's have been collecting toothbrushes, toothpaste, floss containers and toothbrush boxes. Thanks to everyone's recycling we have been able to fill a small bin. These items will be sent off to TerraCycle next week.

Once TerraCycle receives your products, it sorts them, shreds them, then melts them to create a hard plastic that can be used in a number of products.

In the case of your old toothbrushes and toothpaste tubes, they will be turned into upcycled backpacks, notebooks and pens.

Colgate will donate the upcycled items to a number of schools in need in October.
