Pentecost Sunday

When it is really windy, your hair blows all around, your clothes whip around, and leaves and dust blow wildly. The Holy Spirit is like the wind. When the wind blows in, things change; rain comes, or cold weather comes, or snow comes, or sometimes a violent storm comes. When the Holy Spirit blows in, people change. The Holy Spirit can make people brave, smart or excited about God.

After Jesus ascended to heaven, his friends were feeling confused and afraid. The first time the Holy Spirit blew in those feelings of being smart, brave, and excited about God was the day we call Pentecost. The Spirit blew these feelings into Jesus' followers and that was the first day of the Church. We call it the birthday of the Church.

John 20: 10-23

On the evening of the first day of the week, when the doors were locked where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Those sins you forgive they are forgiven, and those sins you retain they are retained."

With this Sunday, feast of Pentecost, we come to the end of the Easter season—the fifty days that follow the forty days of Lent.

Creator Spirit, strengthen our children with Your gifts of grace, to love and serve as disciples of Christ. Grant that they may grow into the fullness of the stature of Christ. Fill them with the joy of Your presence. JUNE PUBLIC HOLIDAY LONG WEEKEND

A reminder to all families that, in addition to Monday 1 June being a Public Holiday, Tuesday 2 June is a school holiday at St Mary's for both students and staff. This holiday was listed on the Term Planner. In recognition of their commitment to Church activities, Catholic school staff are granted one extra day's leave to be taken during the year and adjoining school term holidays or a weekend.

AUSTRALIAN EARLY DEVELOPMENT CENSUS

This term, St Mary's will be taking part in the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC). This is a nationwide census of early childhood development. Based on their observations of each child, Pre Primary teachers record information re development and ability. This census is completed every three years and gives each community in Australia a snapshot of how children have developed by the time they start full time school. The data gathered helps communities and governments to pinpoint the services, resources and support that young children and their families need to help shape the future and wellbeing of Australian children.

All Pre Primary parents received a letter this week explaining AEDC. Participation is not compulsory and if any parent does not want their child's teacher to complete the data for their child, they must return the signed opt-out form by Friday 29 May. All data made available publicly is de-identified and does not include children's names, ages, addresses or schools. Results from the 2009 and 2012 data collections are available through a national report, online maps and community profiles. To see these AEDC results, go to www.aedc.gov.au
