Class Photos/Portraits

- Every Student will have their photo taken, whether they are purchasing photos or not.
- Your child will have been given a personalised online ordering slip by the class Teacher at the beginning of term.
- To order online please visit our website, <u>www.msp.com.au</u> and select <u>Order Online</u>.
 From there you can place your order using your child's unique Shoot Key found on their envelope.
- If not ordering online please ensure that your child returns an envelope with enclosed payment to school on photo day if you wish to purchase photos.
- If you have ordered online, you are not required to return an envelope.
- Please note: The Photographers are not permitted to open the envelopes and cannot provide change.
- The expiry date for online ordering is the **07.06.2017**. Any orders received after this date are treated as re orders and will incur additional costs.

Family Photos:

- Envelopes can be obtained from Administration.
- Family photos are being taken in the morning before school. Please arrive at school by 7.30am for your family photo as the photographers will be taking family photos from 7.45am - 8.15am.
- Please ensure that your family envelope with enclosed payment is handed to the Photographers on photo day.


Special Group Photos:

- If your child is in a Special photo you will receive a link and password to the online gallery after photo day, where you can view and order these photos if required. These photos will be packed and delivered with the school's bulk order.

War on Waste: What plastics can be recycled? Did you know that every type of plastic is fully recyclable?

And at least 20 per cent of what is in our garbage bins right now

should be in our recycle bins!



The most common recycling mistake is throwing in soft plastics such as plastic bags, food packaging or any "scrunchable" plastic in with the rest of your plastic containers. Soft plastics are the number one form of contamination in the recycling system.

What can be put in your kerbside recycle bin?



- · All plastic containers can be recycled including plastic fruit punnets and takeaway containers.
- · Plastic trays such as meat trays or soft food trays differ across councils.
- · Rigid hard plastic trays can be recycled while soft polystyrene trays cannot, which means many councils say no to both.

 Goal of the Month:

Try to reduce your family's use of the 'Big 4' – Stop buying 'one use' plastics

- · Ask for your own Travel Mug to be filled with your daily coffee fix instead of a Styrofoam cup!
- · Remember to bring your own reusable shopping bags and say no to one-use plastic bags.
- · Forego the plastic straw in your next drink!
- · Refill your own water bottle or use a cup instead of buying a plastic one!

National Reconciliation Week Let's take the next steps.

National Reconciliation Week (NRW) celebrates and builds on the respectful relationships shared by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and other Australians. It is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures and achievements and to explore how each of us can join, and positively contribute to, the national reconciliation journey.

The week is bookended by two important anniversaries held on 27 May and 3 June.



- 27 May 1967 A Referendum was held and over 90 per cent of Australian's voted to give the Australian Government power to make laws for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and recognise them in the Census.
- 3 June 1992 The Australian High Court delivered the historic Mabo decision and lead to the legal recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as the Traditional Owner and Custodians of land. This decision paved the way for National Title.

This year these dates mark the 50th anniversary for the Referendum and the 25th of the Mabo decision. To reflect these two significant events, the theme for NRW 2017 is **Let's take the next steps** and invites all Australians to join them on the next stage of our nation's reconciliation journey. They invite us to make history again.

Over the rest of the term there will be various activities occurring in and around the school to celebrate and build on these respectful relationships culminating in NAIDOC Week which occurs July 2 – 9 (the first week of the school holidays).

NAIDOC Week (2 – 9 July)

NAIDOC Week celebrations are held across Australia each July to celebrate the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples. This year's NAIDOC theme is "Our Languages Matter."

To celebrate National NAIDOC Week, The Kids Initiative, is offering all supporting schools the opportunity to win in 'Apple for the Schools' for all schools who order materials to celebrate NAIDOC Week. The prize is a choice between a 15" MacBook Air or school library resources or sporting equipment valued at \$2000.

For all students, there are two competitions running with great prizes to be won. These competitions are:

Colouring-in competition for Years K-2

Poetry competition for all students in Years 3-6
