# Principal's Welcome

Thank you for taking the time to read the newsletter! At last night's P & F meeting it was suggested that not many people read the newsletter and it was asked if we could go back to hard copies? A great deal of time and effort from many people goes into creating an informative, entertaining(?) summary of what has happened at school and what is coming up at St Mary's. Not reading it could be dangerous!! If you send your children to school on 28 August because you haven't read the newsletter, there won't be anyone else at school. We do our best to capture many of the special moments that happen at school and our camera gets quite a work out. Bulk printing of the school newsletter would be an added expense to the school budget and not in line with current efforts towards creating a more sustainable environment. If you have problems with the internet and would like a hard copy sent home, that can be arranged.

Mrs Nikki Webb will be taking well earned Long Service Leave in Term 4. Mrs Megan Turpin will be replacing Mrs Webb in Year 4 until the end of the year. Currently, Mrs Turpin works half a day in Kindy. Mrs Melissa Coulson will be in Kindy in Term 4 on Thursday afternoons.

We have received our students' results from the NAPLAN testing that was carried out in May and I am pleased to say that overall the results are very impressive. Both the Year 3 and Year 5 classes achieved above the national NAPLAN average across all test areas and well above in many. The results reflect the positive home and classroom environments where high expectations of students and teachers help each child reach their potential. We also have in place support and extension programs so that students are continuously challenged. The table shown on the next page reflects just how well our students have done:

Next year, St Mary's will be one of 100 schools across Australia to trial NAPLAN Testing online. What that means is Year 3 and 5 students will be required to type their written responses, so staff are currently exploring programs that we can have the students use to improve their typing skills. Students will have more opportunities to type at school as well as some typing built into homework activities.

Hard copies of each child's individual NAPLAN results in Year 3 and 5 will be sent home next week.

#### SEASONS FOR GROWTH® PROGRAM LEARNING TO LIVE WITH CHANGE AND LOSS

Change and loss are issues that affect all of us at some stage in our lives. # Are You Maximising Your Government Rebates for Outside of School Hours' Care?



If not, you could be paying more than you should. With Child Care Benefit (CCB) and Child Care Rebate (CCR) you could save 50% off the price of after school care.

#### What's the CCR?

The Child Care Rebate offers a 50% reduction on your after school care fees. It is paid by Centrelink directly to your service, which means your out of pocket costs are halved. The CCR is currently NOT means tested and so long as you meet Centrelink's minimum work standards, you should be eligible to apply.

#### What Exactly is the CCB?

It's a Government allowance aimed at helping low income earners with the cost of out of school care. Paid by Centrelink, the CCB is means tested so you'll need to be assessed for your eligible allowance rate. The maximum allowance you can receive from CCB will cover 85% of your after school care fees.

#### How Do I Find Out If I Am Eligible?
