Dear Parents, Students and Friends,

We are now past the mid point of Term 4, a busy term for staff, students and parents. I thank all for their ongoing support and encouragement of each other in the work we do together at St Mary's. With just over four weeks of term remaining, there is still much to be done. Yesterday, we celebrated a Remembrance Day Service led by our Year 6 leaders. It was a most respectful and appropriate service for primary school, with classes from Pre Primary to Year 6, all staff and a number of our family members attending. Thank you to our Year 3/4 students who added to the ceremony by singing 'Lest We Forget', a song they have learned in Choir this year and have performed at the Bunbury Eisteddfod.

We have had a whole school focus on students' uniform, in particular the boys having their shirts tucked in. The boys are to be acknowledged on how they have 'risen to the challenge', now needing only occasional reminders.

We now move on to an emphasis on students stopping and looking at the adult who is speaking to them, using the adult's name when responding and remaining to listen while the adult speaks. We have noticed a trend with a number of our students responding with "nah" or "yeah" when a teacher speaks to them or asks them a question, and walking off as the adult is speaking.

We ask that parents remind children of this aspect of manners and respect, and I thank you for your support with this. May we continue to move through Term 4 working together towards our common goal and our motto of Respect, Faith and Courage.

The Zoo:

Monday 2 November at 8:30 in the morning was a special moment for the twenty-nine Year Five students, for this day was the day that we were all waiting for. We were off to Perth for our zoo camp.

We took the three hour bus trip to Perth. It was a bit awkward as we were on a public bus and we

are not used to travelling on a bus with people that we don't know. First we went to the statues we were studying called The Footsteps in Time which are statues of five men who contributed to the development of Perth over the years.

We then walked to the Perth Mint where we saw gold being poured. When we were there, we watched a video about the history of gold and how it came to Earth. We also saw gold ingots, nuggets and flakes. We felt how heavy half a gold ingot was, and last of all we weighed ourselves to see how much money we would be worth if we were gold. Then we saw the full cycle of a gold ingot as it got melted, moulded and cooled down which was really cool.



We then went to another statue at Hay Street which I think most of you have seen. It's the man on his hands called Percy Button. We also played in the water fountain's maze. Most of us got soaked!

We went to the Stirling Gardens to see two statues called Alexander Forrest at the entrance and the Memory Markers at the back. We also went there to have lunch.

Next we went for a swift walk to the Bell Tower. There were eighteen over two hundred and fifty kilogram bells. We all got to ring one which was awesome. We then went up to the top. Even though we were only twenty-five metres above ground, it felt like we were over a hundred (maybe only for me because I am extremely afraid of heights). When we got back to the ground, we walked to the banks of the Swan River to catch a ferry to a place we've all been waiting for: The Perth Zoo.

When we arrived, we met our zoo instructors, Steve and Lindsay, and walked to the place we would be sleeping, the Homestead Barn and put our bags away. We then got our first activity, The Race to Save. The



Race to Save is a bit like the Amazing Race. We go around the zoo in five groups, coming to endangered animal exhibits where we find a question, then we answer it, put it on a crossword and find a clue to the next animal. The team with the most correct answers win. I'm pretty sure we won. We then petted an Inland Bearded Dragon, and got to build an animal enrichment object. We did it for the Sun Bears, Boppa and Jamran. We built a huge ice block with little bits of salmon inside. The last thing we did for the night was a night walk in the African Savanna.

We got to see pretty much every animal except the Fennec Foxes which almost never comes out, the giraffes and the meerkats. After that we were all asleep as soon as our heads reached our pillow.

The next day we had breakfast and then said goodbye to Steve and Lindsay after we played a game of scrambled eggs and a remembrance game. Then we toured around the whole zoo in the same groups as The Race to Save. Our group got to see every single animal in the zoo. Then we took the long road home.
