Recycling Nespresso Pods: Year 2

All pods collected by the Year 2 class are delivered to a facility in Bunbury where they are disposed of correctly. The capsules are shredded and melted down and turned into new aluminium products. Residual coffee is separated and sent to an industrial composting facility.

We are close to filling our first bin of pods so keep bringing them in. The final week of collection will be Week 7. Don't forget, to save them over the holidays as we will be back in 2018, aiming to recycle even more pods!
