Principal's Welcome

Life is never dull at St Mary's with another wide range of learning opportunities enjoyed by students. Since our last newsletter we have watched the dramatic storytelling skills of our Year 1 students in their sharing of four Aboriginal Dreamtime stories (see photos.) We were visited by Dr Tristan Clemons who is a past student and the goalkeeper for the Australian Hockey team and a doctor of Nano Science (see photos.) The students have also been involved in a Daily Science Quiz and lunchtime Science challenges, courtesy of Mrs Murray. There has also been an opportunity for them to take part in a Yoga class provided by the P & F.

Last Sunday, our First Reconciliation candidates and their families attended the Commitment Mass at the Cathedral. First Reconciliation for the twenty seven students involved will be at the Cathedral on Tuesday 29 August starting at the new time of **5.45pm**.

We have had a very positive response so far to our 3 Year Old Program that will commence in February next year. We already have eleven enrolments with only twenty places available. Application forms are available from the office and a \$20 fee will secure your child's position and that will be deducted from Term 1 fees. Our 3 Year Old Program will operate for a full day on Fridays, at a cost of \$63 per child under the guidance of Mrs Liz Harper.

Year One Assembly

Last week, the Year One Assembly was the culmination of a unit of work based on the 'Dreaming' of our indigenous people. The exploration of this theme was integrated into many areas of the curriculum - History, Geography, English, Science, The Arts and Religion. The children enjoyed exploring the rich culture of traditional Aboriginal life and learned of their deep spiritual connection with the land and of their knowledge of their natural environment. They were also quick to recognize the many similarities between the moral teachings of the elders and the teachings of Jesus, namely, caring for each other and for creation, respecting the needs of others and living our lives guided by rules and beliefs. The four 'Dreaming' stories, dramatized so enthusiastically and respectfully by the Year One children, highlight the ancient wisdom of our indigenous people as they pass on valuable life lessons through the art of storytelling. Thukeri, Tiddalik, Brolga and How The Birds Got Their Colours remain so relevant today as they so simply and effectively convey the inevitable consequences of greed, the importance of kindness and the sacredness of our environment. Congratulations Year One, we thought you were fabulous.

Important information regarding your child's CDF Student Passbook Accounts

Today's students live in a high-tech world. Coins, notes & paper passbook accounts have become 'tap & go' and App based mobile payments. Alongside this rapid technological change the Catholic Development Fund is facing a more rigorous Government regulatory environment. Joining with other CDF's across Australia in a new CDF Community Fund they are committed to continuing to provide savings offerings for students.

They are now offering students a 31 Day Mission Student Saver Account. This new wholly online savings account is for pre-school, primary and secondary school students.

Students can earn **bonus interest** for regular savings (currently up to a total amount possible of **2.35% p.a**). They can also feel really good that their money, pooled with the money of other students, is being used to support the growth of the Church by building new schools, parishes, hospitals and aged care facilities.

The CDF are asking for your support to transition your child now to the new 31 Day Mission Saver. Go to <u>www.cdfcommunityfund.org.au/students</u> and fill out the form (tick 'existing student'). Please note an adult will need to be the 'authoriser' on the account and will need to fill out the application form and upload "ID" as part of the process due to changes in Government regulations.

The traditional CDF School passbook savings accounts will be discontinued at the end of Term 3 on 22 September, 2017. CDF will be contact all account holders regarding a process of transitioning to the new 31 Day Mission Saver account.
