Friday 22nd Sept —Book Week Dress Up Day


Following the Year 4 Assembly and Merit Awards we will all have a chance to show off our costumes to the school community during a Book Week Parade!

Dear Parent/Caregiver

Re: Influenza and Influenza-like Illness at St Mary's Catholic Primary School, Bunbury

The Health Department has been contacted by the St Mary's Catholic Primary School, due to concern about the rising number of students experiencing respiratory illnesses. The Health Department can confirm there are increasing numbers of cases of influenza and influenza-like illnesses in the South West.

These highly contagious illnesses are mainly spread by droplets made when an infected person coughs or sneezes and can also be spread through touching surfaces where infected droplets have landed.

Symptoms of influenza include fever, cough, sore throat, headache, chills, muscle aches, tiredness and vomiting. It is generally more severe than the common cold and lasts much longer. Some people are at more risk of serious disease and can develop serious complications such as bronchitis, pneumonia, or in severe cases, death. People experiencing moderate to severe symptoms should see their GP.

Children and staff who are sick with the symptoms listed above should stay away from school until the symptoms have resolved. This is recommended so they don't pass the illness onto other people, and so they can get proper rest and recover more quickly from the illness.

Simple steps to stop the spread of flu include:

- Cover your nose and mouth when you cough or sneeze
- Throw used tissues in a rubbish bin
- Wash your hands thoroughly and often for at least 10 seconds especially after coughing, sneezing or blowing your nose, or use an alcohol-based hand rub
- Stay home until you are well, to avoid infecting others


Bunbury Catholic College cordially invite you to our upcoming Exhibitions at both Marist and Mercy Campuses for 2017.


