NATIONALLY CONSISTENT COLLECTION OF DATA: School Students with Disability

All Australian Governments have agreed to implement an annual national data collection on school students with disability. From 2015, this data collection will occur in every school, every year. The data will help better target support and resources for schools.

There are students with disability in every school in Australia at some point. The National Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005 mean that schools and education systems are required to make, where needed, reasonable adjustments for students with disability. An adjustment is a measure or action taken to assist a student with disability to participate in education on the same basis as other students. Adjustments can be made across the whole school setting, in the classroom and at individual student level.

Data is managed to ensure that confidential information is not disclosed. No individual student will be identified in the data collection as names are not provided, only a total number of students. The following information will be collected annually at the school level:

- The level of adjustment provided
- The number of students receiving each level of adjustment
- · The type of disability

A student will only be included in the data collection if he/she meets the definition of disability under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the school has evidence of this.
