UNIFORM SHOP/SCHOOL OFFICE CLOSURE

Please note that the Uniform Shop will not be open on Friday 16 September. The school office will open briefly on that morning and then close for the duration of the Athletics Carnival. Following the Carnival, the office will reopen until 4pm as per normal closing time.

ABSENTEES

Parents are reminded that written absentee notes with student name, date, reason for absence and parent signature MUST be provided for all student absences - a legal requirement from the Education Department of WA. Please notify the school by phone call or email if your child will be absent.

Remember, even though you may have notified the school of your child's absence via phone or email, you must still send a signed note. This is a legal requirement.

When teachers have completed class rolls each morning, the school office will SMS parents for any unexplained/not notified absences each day.

Students arriving at school late, i.e. after the morning siren, MUST come through the office and be signed in by their parent/caregiver. Students are NOT permitted to sign themselves in. Should a student need to leave school early, their parent/caregiver must sign the student out at the office, even if the class teacher has been notified. Our Duty of Care requires us to account for each student during school hours, 8:45am to 3:10pm.

SPORTS CARNIVAL ABSENTEES/BUS TRAVEL

Please note that the Kindergarten class will run as normal on Athletics Carnival Day and all children are expected to be in attendance. Students who will not be attending school are required to provide a note to the school, that is signed by their parent/caregiver BEFORE the day of the carnival.

TIPS ON CHOOSING SEEDLINGS

- Avoid plants that look over or under watered - this will show as stunted growth and yellowing of leaves.
- Avoid any seedlings that show signs of insect or physical damage.
- Seedlings that are leggy, yellow in colour or browning off are no good. These plants are under stress and have the propensity to bolt to seed after they're planted out.
