Important Information

Kindergarten 2020

Current families who have children due to begin Kindergarten in 2020 are asked to ensure that their Applications for Enrolment have been handed in to the school office as soon as possible.

Absentees

Parents are reminded that written absentee notes with student name, date, reason for absence and parent signature MUST be provided for all student absences - a legal requirement from the Education Department of WA. Please notify the school by phone call or email if your child will be absent. When teachers have completed class rolls each morning, the school office will SMS parents for any unexplained/not notified absences each day. A follow up phone call will be made if the school receives no response to text messages. Students arriving at school late, i.e. after the morning siren, MUST come through the office and be signed in by their parent/caregiver. STUDENTS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO SIGN THEMSELVES IN. Should a student need to leave school early, their parent/caregiver must sign the student out at the office, even though the class teacher may have been notified. Our Duty of Care requires us to account for each student during school hours, 8:45am to 3:10pm. Remember, even though you have phoned or emailed the school with your child's absence, you must still send a signed note. This is a legal requirement.

Full Family Details Update

Full Family Details forms have been sent home this week. Please update any changes to your details and return the form by Friday 15 February. If there are no changes, please sign the form and return it by the aforementioned date. It is important to inform the office if there have been changes to family contact details: address, phone number, email, emergency contact details. In order to provide duty of care for our students, these details must be kept up to date. Thank you.

Parents Visiting During School Hours

Parents are reminded that if they visit the school during school hours (including parents assisting in classes and the Canteen), they are required to sign in and sign out at the office. This enables us to account for everyone on the school site in the case of an emergency. Our Duty of Care also requires us to know who is on the school site during school hours.

Jewellery

No jewellery may be worn, other than a functional watch, and (if ears are pierced) ONE earring stud or sleeper in BOTH EARLOBES. This restriction is in keeping with school philosophy of reducing the importance of material goods and the risk of injury. Children are not permitted to wear nail polish.

Hair

Hair should be always neat and tidy and should not reflect the extremes of any current fashion. Long hair must be kept neatly tied back. Ribbons or clips must be PLAIN white or blue. Matching headbands can be purchased from the Uniform Shop. Hair must be kept at the student's natural hair colour, without artificial hair colour added.

Notice from WA Country Health Service - South West

Update to the Australian Immunisation Schedule: children receiving their 4 year old immunisations **must be at least 4 years old**, they can no longer receive them from 3.5 years.

The reason for this change is to offer longer protection into childhood now that the 18 month dose of Diphtheria, Tetanus and Pertussis (whooping cough) has been reinstated. Please contact your immunisation or healthcare provider for further information.

Fr Gerald: I like to share my talent.

Cleo: What is your favourite thing about Australia?

Fr Gerald: I like that everyone is equal, the climate and how we look after the environment.

Samuel: Besides your family, what else do you miss about the Philippines? *Fr Gerald:* Not much. I like the food but I can cook that here. There is too much traffic in Manila.
