From the Principal

Dear Parents, Students and Friends,

Last week I had the opportunity to attend the Catholic Primary Principals' Conference in Perth. The organisers work hard to find some of the world's leading educators to present the latest ideas. One of the presenters at the conference was Dr Tracey Tokuhama-Espinosa who lives in South America. Tracey works with the University of Harvard and is the author of eight books on mind, brain and education science, as well as dozens of related articles. Tracey discussed many thought-provoking points about the brain and how it is important as educators to understand how the brain works. Some of her ideas that can impact how we teach included:

- Attention + Memory = Learning
- Memory is fragile and one word can evoke other memories.

 We all have bias and our brain uses short cuts called heuristics that allow us to make quick judgements. When faced with something new we need to clear our heads and approach it with an open mind, so we are not influenced by bias.

- Writing requires one of the highest levels of thinking.
- People whose minds are open to new possibilities learn faster. By entertaining the idea you could be wrong, you listen better.
- Learning takes a great deal of energy. The first thing the brain does is go to heuristics which is why you need to work at staying open to new ideas.
- Part of learning is to understand you are biased and you use heuristics in order to go forward.
- It is natural to presume negative thoughts of other groups.
- Fear is easiest for the brain to understand and empathy is difficult.
- You cannot learn higher order thinking skills without guidance.
- The brain is social and learns best in groups.
- Differences in people help us to learn.
- Your brain adapts to what it does most.

I plan to do further reading on Tracey's work, so watch for further updates on the brain and how it works in the newsletter.

Interschool Cross Country








Book Club
