Literacy	Activities Daily: My Phonics Book In your remote learning pack there is a 'My Phonics Book'. Page 1 – Vocabulary and quiz questions e.g. How many letters in the alphabet? How can we write them? What is a consonant? What is a vowel? What is a digraph?

	Page 2: The Alphabet – Questions on the page
	Page 3: Onset and rime – Questions on the page
	Page 4: Beginning and ending blends – questions on the page
	Extension – continue with the My Phonics Book

	1. Continue with sight words
	2. Daily reading – read with an adult for 10 minutes, discuss and enjoy!
	3. At the end of the week choose the story you enjoyed most. Draw a picture and write at least
	two sentences about it. See Seesaw for this activity.
	4. Printing daily. Parents, in your pack you will find the 'My Handwriting Book', an information
	page is included. Complete a page a day.
	5. Copy the 'nt' words from seesaw into your workbook. Read them out to a family member.
	Don't forget to decorate your cover.
Mathematics	Daily: Using the resource book revise, orally, the days of the week, months of the year and the
manico	seasons, using the sample questions to guide the revision.
	Additional Activities:
	 Children to write the days of the week in order using capital letters to start the word including
	a sentence – link with ordinal numbers
	e.g. Sunday 1 st – Sunday is the first day of the week.
	Monday 2 nd – Monday is the second day of the week.
	 Seasons: Talk about the seasons: What 'season baby' are they?
	What season is it now?
	What are the elements of Autumn? On a blank page, illustrate and label months, likely
	weather, clothing, food, activities, landscape features, etc.
	 Practise 'number bonds to ten' using the wipe off number board (sample in resource book)
	 Complete Week 9's problem solving question on Seesaw. Don't forget to show your working
	out and write a number sentence to go with the picture. Click on the green tick in Seesaw to
	submit.
	You will need the 6 Australian coins you can use either the paper ones in your remote bag or
	real coins. Arrange your coins from least value to greatest value. Copy this order into your
	Maths workbook. Label your coins using numbers and words. Draw two ways to make \$1.00
	using any coins. Remember \$1.00 is equal to 100 cents.
