From the Principal

Dear Parents, Students and Friends,

There is no doubting the fact that we live in a lucky country. We are blessed to be in a position of having our lives returning to near normal while sadly, in so many places in the world, COVID 19 continues to devastate lives.

With Stage 4 of the restrictions taking effect on Saturday and Stage 5 planned to happen in the holidays, I am expecting that many of the safety measures that we have in place at school to be eased by the start of Term 3, but I am waiting for further guidance from the Catholic Education Office. I will send out a message to parents as soon as I can with an update.

Sacraments Able to Happen

I have been contacted by Bishop Holohan and I am very pleased that the changes to the COVID Restrictions mean that we are able to continue with our Sacramental Program on the following dates:

First Reconciliation – Thursday 30 July at 6pm at the Cathedral First Holy Communion – Sunday 30 August at 10am Mass at the Cathedral

Confirmation – Sunday 9 August at 10am Mass at the Cathedral.

Due to the tight timeframe for the Sacraments, handouts and instructions for parents will be sent home rather than a parent meeting and there will not be the traditional "Commitment Masses,' although parents are strongly encouraged to take their children to Mass, particularly leading up to them celebrating one of the Sacraments.

Report Comments

Reports will be sent home at the end of the term. You might find the comments look shorter and the format a little different than normal and that is

due to the time that students spent on remote learning. Any questions that you have around your child's reports will be answered during parent/teacher interviews scheduled to take place at the beginning of Term 3. The booking sheets outside of classrooms will be taken down tomorrow afternoon so do not miss your opportunity to make an appointment if you haven't already.

We are saying farewell to two staff members at the end of this term. Mrs Yvonne Smith has been working as our gardener/maintenance person for the last 18 months and has done an amazing job that included working closely with Year 6 students on the veggie patches. Yvonne is moving back into community care which is a field that she has worked in previously. Mrs Sonia Van Wyck has been part of our Education Assistant team for the past twelve months and she has developed a fantastic rapport with students. Both will be greatly missed.
