As this is a remote role, where you will be answering the calls from Help Seekers, independently, from your own home, you must have the following:

- Space enabling confidentiality, privacy and focus, ensuring no interruptions during your 4-hour shift
 A dependable and safe internet connection

To be successful in the role of a Remote Telephone Crisis Supporter, you need to be:

- Autonomous Problem aoleer Resilient Compassionate Empathetic Good listener Respectful Non-judgemental Open-minded

- + Basic computer literacy (internet, email,
- data entry, navigation). Verbal and written English
- communication skills
