

Uniform Shop

The Uniform Shop is open every Friday morning for uniform supplies or online ordering through CDF Pay is an alternate option. Summer uniform is required to be worn in its enirety from 8 November 2021. From Monday 25 October to Friday 5 November, sports uniform is to be worn for the duration of swimming lessons. The Uniform Shop will be closed on Friday 5 November to enable Pre-Primary ordering to take place. Pre-Primary parents with children attending Year 1 in 2022, your uniform ordering day will take place in the Early Childhood Centre on Friday 5 November from 8.30am - 9.30am. A selection of sizes will be available for fittings. Parents of children attending Pre-Primary next year, you have the opportunity to try on and place order the following Tuesday afternoon 9 November from 2.15pm - 3pm. Please note that for the rest of Term 4, online uniform orders placed on Mondays will only be filled the next day.

Thanks to all participants that have registered here are a few things you need to know for the event.

- We have 290 participants so please arrive 10-15min early so that we can start on time. We will be doing a staggered start so no one gets trampled.
- Staff will do their best to throw the powder around the participants torso area however wind & other factors can cause the powder to protrude onto the face so please bring goggles or sunglasses to protect your eyes.
- Wear a white top so the colours show up better.
- There will be a water slide & other wet stations so you may want to bring a towel & change of clothes.
- There will be an obstacle course set up over the 2 ovals with 7 stations where participants will be sprayed with colour.

 There will be an area for Colour Bomb the teachers, this will be a cost of \$1 a throw so please bring small change.

- There will be a first aid station with clean water if participants need to rinse their face.
- Sausage sizzle will be ready when the event finishes so if you have placed an ordered please make sure you get the correct amount & have your name ticked off. We will have some extras for those that have not ordered however when they run out that's it.


